The term education itself means 'to train', 'to lead out' and to 'bring up'. It is said that education is a life-long process, but the basic education that one undergoes during the formative years definitely contributes to the shaping of one's future and outlook. At this point, the school and high school education assumes importance. Even though the history of education in Nepal is relatively short, there has been

a considerable growth in the number of educational institutes after the restoration of democracy in 1950 and particularly after 1990 AD. However, having no standard measuring rod to use when evaluating the institutes of higher education, students and parents have had trouble when selecting a college.

Furthermore, beguiling advertisements make it impossible to decide which college is genuinely worth attending. Nowadays, it cannot be denied that numerous mediocre institutes exist which try to make a quick buck and cheat the students. This may not always be the case, but such incidents cannot be overlooked. Hence, this subject and possible solutions are analysed in this comprehensive study.

Results of two studies on higher education and employment in the USSR and the Federal Republic of Germany (West Germany) are presented. India is in the throes of great developments in the field of higher education. This book will be a valuable resource for centres of education and higher education in universities and research organisations, as well as think-tanks. It would also be a useful tool for consultants and private organisations working in the higher education sector.

Foreword In the modern world knowledge has become the chief instrument of human progress. Human resources of a country have thus become a strategic consideration with the developed and the developing country's alike. Many countries in Asia, Europe and the American continent are already reviewing and re-assessing their education systems with a futuristic perspective. Leonid I. Brezhnev

The Eleventh Plan (2007-12) sought to build on the gains achieved in the Tenth Plan and shift the economy to a path of faster and more inclusive growth. The Mid-Term Appraisal reviews the experience in the first three years of the Eleventh Plan and seeks to identify sectors where corrective steps may be needed to ensure that growth is broad-based and inclusive. The report specifically reviews the progress made in five critical areas: Aggregate and sectoral growth; Inclusiveness and poverty reduction; Infrastructure development; Plan financing; Governance Focusing on the vulnerable sections of the population--Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), Other Backward Classes (OBCs), women, and minorities, the report assesses the programmes aimed at providing access to health, education, and other essential services, as well as livelihood support to the poor. In addition, it identifies some important policy issues which were not fully recognized at the time the Eleventh Plan was drafted such as an integrated energy policy, water management, climate

change, new technologies, and innovation. Going beyond making mid-course corrections, the report calls for an in-depth review of the policies in these areas in order to attain the goal of sustainable development.

Mid-term Appraisal Eleventh Five Year Plan, 2007-2012

This work is a comprehensive study of the social problems facing India at present. It is the first study of its kind and provides a coordinated picture of social problems confronted by India particularly after Independence. The revised editions now divided into five volumes. Volume One presents an analysis of the causes of Social and Personal Disorganization and deals with the problems of crime and juvenile delinquency, major social vices, maladjustment in institutions resulting in poverty and unemployment, population explosion, undernutrition, mass illiteracy, students' indiscipline, moral degeneration, misuse of leisure, corruption, family disintegration and community conflicts in the form of casteism, provincialism, lingualism and communalism.

The chapters' topics are as follows: (1) education before 1920, the school system's initial goals and activities, and the anti-illiteracy campaign through 1959; (2) the development of universal 8-year schooling through the forties, fifties, and early sixties, including efforts to make education more practical and improve teacher training; (3) creating a "new intelligentsia" to further revolutionary goals, while preserving Azerbaijanian culture; (4) the development and "Azerbaijanization" of programs to train specialists; (5) the establishment of 10-year compulsory education in the late 1960's, attendant problems, and new policy approaches and methods; (6) the influence of scientific and technological progress in training of specialists and skilled workers; (7) the relationship of higher education to economic and technological progress, and planning methods designed to strengthen that relationship; and (8) the international significance of Azerbaijan's accomplishment.
