Far too many business leaders fail to realize—until it is too late—that the relentless pursuit of volume at all cost is not the key to long-term profits and success. *The Customer Trap: How to Avoid the Biggest Mistake in Business* is Thomas and Wilkinson's sequel to *The Distribution Trap: Keeping Your Innovations from Becoming Commodities*, which

Lower margins become the norm and cost-saving compromises on quality take over. In time, the brand suffers and, in some cases, fails outright. Stark examples from Oreck Vacuum Cleaners, Rubbermaid, Goodyear, Levi's, and others illustrate the perils of falling into the "customer trap." This book demonstrates in vivid detail how to thrive by controlling your sales and distribution.
