On Political Economists and Modern Political Economy

In March 1997, we launched the Japan Association for Evolutionary Economics (JAFEE) to gather the academic minds that, out of dissatisfaction with established dynamic approaches, were separately searching for new approaches to economics. To our surprise and joy, as many as 500 members, including graduate students, joined us. Later that year Prof. Horst Hanusch, then President of the International Joseph A. Schumpeter Society, remarked that such a start would take a couple of decades in Europe to prepare for.
